In response to these challenges, the study advocates for the introduction of specialized courses in vocational colleges, the cultivation of dedicated teaching staff, enhanced school-enterprise collaborations, and the establishment of a vibrant campus culture. Notably, this research pioneers the exploration of Li Yue culture inheritance through the lens of vocational education, marking a significant contribution to existing literature. The implications of this study hold substantial value for practitioners involved in Li Yue skills inheritance, relevant vocational institutions, and local governmental bodies, offering a pathway to rejuvenate and sustain this vital cultural legacy for future generations.
